POETIC AND POLITICAL

August 15, 2017 - July 8, 2018

Poetic and Political explored two realms of perception often considered oppositional but more likely to work in tandem to make a rich, provocative and compelling visual impact. The exhibition juxtaposed the work of Josef Albers, a single artist focused on the psychic and emotive qualities of color, with African and African American artists who confront the historic and contemporary traces of colonialism as they contribute to the power of healing and renewal.

HISTORY, LABOR, LIFE: THE PRINTS OF JACOB LAWRENCE

February 13 - August 5, 2018

This exhibition provided an overview of influential American artist Jacob Lawrence (1917–2000).

Lawrence was primarily concerned with the narration of African American experiences and histories. His acute observations of community life, work, struggle and emancipation during his lifetime were rendered alongside vividly imagined chronicles of the past. The past and present in his work are intrinsically linked, providing insight into the social, economic and political realities that continue to impact and shape contemporary society today.

CONSERVING TREASURES: JAMINI ROY AND MODERN INDIAN ART

March 21 - August 5, 2018

One cannot overstate the importance of Jamini Roy's (1887 – 1972) revolutionary role in the development of modern Indian art from late colonial period to the establishment of India as a nation state in 1947. Although formally trained in European academic realism, the folk art traditions of his native region of Bengal significantly influenced Roy's mature painting style. Folk art inspired Roy to forge a powerful weapon of anti-colonial resistance through his art.

AMERICAN ABSTRACTION

February 21, 2017 - August 19, 2018

The American artists featured in this exhibition represented fine examples from a large and diverse body of the movements that have defined abstraction since 1945. Artists in these decades grappled with the making of meaning through artistic expression, the science of illusion, the power of color and shape, and the experimental possibilities of form and gesture.

PORTRAITS OF FACES | PLACES FROM THE HARN PHOTOGRAPHY COLLECTION

May 15 - October 7, 2018

Faces | Places celebrated the Harn's growing photography collection. It highlighted fifty-five photographs, several seen here for the first time. The exhibition took us on a global tour through photographs that describe the look and feel of places, and the specificity of bodies and faces from around the world. Spanning eras, cultures, and genres, each is vastly different; yet they share recognizable states of being or becoming, such as exhaustion on a Coney Island beach or China's industrial growth.

RESILIENT VISIONS: HAITIAN ART

April 25 - November 13, 2018

This exhibition provided a glimpse of the wide diversity of genres, media and inspirations of Haitian art from 1969 to the first decade of the 21st century. Within this variety, it revealed a common vision shared by an array of Haitian artists. *Resilient Visions* includeed images of everyday life and historical scenes from artists who were labeled as Indigénistes for their representations of local subjects, and as primitivists for their lack of academic training. Also represented was a work by a

Haitian artist who studied in France and embraced modernism and abstraction, and later social realism. Other works were created for the worship of Vodou spirits, or loa.

SHOW METHE MINI

March 21, 2017 - November 25, 2018

This exhibition, which was drawn from the Harn's permanent collection of Asian art, highlighted an overlooked theme in Asian art and presented a unique opportunity to remind viewers that art comes in all shapes and sizes. It also illuminated the investigation by our collective via constant inquiries into size, scale, modeling, technique, means/opportunities, and intellectual and theoretic growth.

THE GREAT CATASTROPHE: REMEMBERING WWI, 1914 - 1918


July 3, 2018 - February 3, 2019

This exhibition, curated by Harn Curator
of Photography Carol McCusker and
collector Robert C. Sanchez, focused on the
portrayal of WWI by artists and illustrators through posters
and prints (from Sanchez's collection) and postcards and items
of popular culture from the collection of UF History Professor
Geoffrey Giles. Also in the exhibition were the WWI personal
effects of Russell Hull (grandfather of Gainesville's Russell Etling)
who survived the brutal Meuse-Argonne Offensive.

The World to Come: Art in the Age of the

Anthropocene chronicles an era of rapid, radical and irrevocable ecological change through works of art by 45 contemporary international artists. We live in a world of imminent extinctions,

runaway climate change and the depletion of

biodiversity and resources. Our age has been identified as the Anthropocene, a controversial term used to name a new geological epoch

defined by human impact.

I, TOO, AM AMERICA: CIVIL RIGHTS PHOTOGRAPHS BY STEVE SCHAPIRO

October 30, 2018 - March 31, 2019

The exhibition had three distinct sections. The central component consisted of forty black and white photographs by activist-photojournalist, Steve Schapiro, who traveled in the 1960s with James Baldwin, Martin Luther King, Robert Kennedy, and Muhammad Ali. Schapiro's photographs capture key moments during marches and rallies, as well as candid moments with the major leaders of the Movement that have become emblematic of that volatile era.

THE ART OF PEDRO PABLO OLIVA

March 2 - July 7, 2019

Pedro Pablo Oliva (born 1949) is one of Cuba's most famous and influential living artists. Known as a chronicler of his time, Oliva's fantastical and provocative paintings, drawings and sculptures reflect Cuba's social, cultural and political life during the last half-century.

ART OF INOUIRY: JURIED EXHIBITION

March 5 - July 7, 2019

In the spirit of probing analysis, the Art of Inquiry: Juried Exhibition showcased original works of art by many of the most talented artists of the Gainesville regional community. Established and emerging artists who reside in or have close ties to the Gainesville region were eligible to submit entries for consideration in the exhibition. Of the 378 works of art submitted, 52 were selected to be a part of the exhibition by jurors Matthew McLendon, J. Sanford Miller Family Director of The Fralin Museum of Art at the University of Virginia, and Jaime DeSimone, Associate Curator of Contemporary Art at the Portland Museum of Art.

DIVERGENT CONVERGENCE: THE ARTS OF CREATIVITY, **DISCOVERY & INOUIRY**

March 31 - July 21, 2019

This exhibition included more than 55 artists from 18 countries. The wide range of media—from ceramics, light sculpture, and film to paintings, prints, and drawings—allowed for the convergence of diverse voices and ideas to enliven discussions throughout the galleries. INSIGHTS: GIFTS FROM ROBERT AND NANCY MAGOON

August 7, 2018 - August 25, 2019

This exhibition celebrated contributions to the Harn Museum collection from Dr. Robert (Bob) and Nancy Magoon and honors the legacy of Bob Magoon, who passed away in January 2018. Their commitment to collecting art by young artists enabled them to curate a collection of works by many of today's most acclaimed contemporary artists. With this exhibition, we recognized Bob and Nancy Magoon's passion for contemporary art and their love for and generosity to the Harn and the University of Florida.

REMAKING HISTORY: ART IN TIME

August 7, 2018 - August 25, 2019

ReMaking History: Art in Time explored the relationship of art to history, memory and time. Twenty-three artists, from Europe, Africa and the Americas, investigated how the past is constructed as history and how art can conceptualize and critique historical representation. The exhibition was organized along five themes that draw connections across time and space, including Time After Time, The Dispossessed, The Former West, Post-Colonial, and War.

CENTURY featured thirty-eight new photographs added to the Harn's permanent collection in the last two years. They are by celebrated photographers such as Lewis Hine, André Kertész, Laura Gilpin, Walker Evans, Helen Levitt, Eudora Welty, W. Eugene Smith, Larry Burrows and Danny Lyon. Each image carries the photographer's urgency to capture specific moments (sometimes at great risk) for us, the viewers. Such hard-won efforts demand our careful looking at the beautiful and difficult visual warp and weft of eras and events that inspire or warn. A few of these images even changed the course of history.

INSIDE OUTSIDE: OUTSIDE INSIDE—A CENTURY OF EAST ASIAN LANDSCAPES 1900S - 2000S

December 18, 2018 - December 1, 2019

Inside Outside: Outside Inside—A Century of East Asian Landscapes 1900s–2000s highlighted how East Asian landscape traditions remain vibrant in our contemporary world. Artists from China, Japan, and Korea, in dialogue with earlier conventions, often simultaneously echo and contradict artistic traditions. Employing new media and methods of interpretation, many of the artists use formats that clearly are rooted in tradition but reflect the rapid transformation of urban and natural environments.

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
